

Since 2015, the EPB has been an independent entity, with its Secretariat hosted by the Netherlands Organisation for Scientific Research (NWO) in The Hague. Established in 1995, the EPB was earlier an Expert Board of the European Science Foundation, formed to provide strategic advice on Arctic and Antarctic issues.



To be the **strong** collective voice of European research in the polar regions, providing **independent** policy advice at national and international levels.



for European polar researchers.


